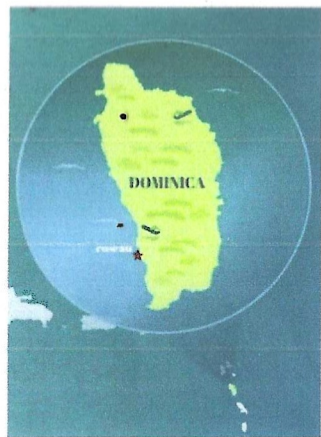


Where is *Dominica*?

Where to swim in *Dominica*?

The most beautiful beach of Dominica is:



Champagne Reef

Located in the south-west, at the northern tip of the Soufriere Scotts Head Marine Reserve, this is a mixed black sand and rock beach famed for its snorkelling reef and submerged volcanically active bubbles.

The sea temperature fluctuates between 26 and 29°C all year.

You can snorkel and scuba dive here and the closer you get to the streams of bubbles, the warmer the water gets. Oceanic animals aren't the biggest fans of the warm water, but the reef right next to where the gas bubbles are released is vibrant with sea sponges, anemones, hard and soft corals, lots of colorful fish, and even the occasional Hawksbill turtle.

Emerald Pool

One of Dominica's most visited attractions, Emerald Pool, is a small 40 foot waterfall that cascades into a

pool that appears green with the sunlight. Located in the heart of the island, at the northern edge of Morne Trois Pitons National Park, Emerald Pool has become rather iconic as a visual representation of Dominica.

What to visit in *Dominica*?



Morne Trois Pitons National Park

In 1997, Morne Trois Pitons National Park was recognized by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site, the first enlisted natural site in the Eastern Caribbean. The park is like stepping back in time. Lush, green primordial rainforests slope up to magnificent peaks. Rivers rush past giant ferns as the fragrance of island flowers surrounds you. Morne Trois Pitons National Park is truly what the Caribbean was meant to be.
