Kumina is an Afro-Jamaican religion developed in Jamaica, after the emancipation of the slaves, by a small community of Bantu immigrants from the Congo region. The religion first appeared in the 1850s. It is only known and practiced in the parish of St. Thomas (and, to a lesser extent, in St. Mary's and St. Catherine's), where these immigrants landed from the Congo to work on the plantations.

Kumina is a religion, a culture, a music and a dance.

Dancers move in a circle, counterclockwise, around the drums in the center, moving their feet along the floor, their backs held in an almost erect posture. Hips, ribcage, shoulders and arms become involved as pirouettes, falls and breaks in body movement occur throughout the dance.
